# Letter from the Executive Director

That's why when we lost funding for the General Counseling program that served as the backbone of VCS services since its inception, we didn't back down or abandon the program. Instead, we adapted, and General Counseling evolved into Wellness Coaching - a modern day solution that clients of any background can access and utilize to find greater life satisfaction. With the development of our own training program and coaching curriculum, we keep moving forward.

Whether it's building a skyscraper, organizing a new campaign, or ensuring the long term stability of an agency like VCS, success begins with laying down a strong foundation. 2024 was a year of foundation building for VCS. Bringing on more staff – including clinical support staff, a full time psychiatrist, and peer support staff – has allowed our clinic to accommodate more clients and provide more holistic care. This year, we added support staff for billing and marketing, and also reimagined our administrative makeup to better represent our services.

Today, we face yet another challenge in the form of Medicaid having an uncertain future and large cuts to government grants, both of which threaten nonprofits such as our own. There's no guarantee as to what the healthcare landscape will look like in a few years. Still, in the face of uncertainty, I believe that we are well situated for the next chapter of VCS's story. Like Dory, we'll just keep swimming, and we're grateful to our clients, friends, and supporters for swimming along with us.

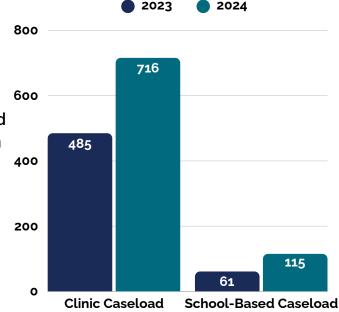
# **Our Clinic**

#### Compared to 2023, we saw:

**+81%** A huge increase in amount of time spent directly with clients in the clinic

+63% A big rise in the number of unique clients served

Our MHOTRS clinic caseload skyrocketed this year at our main office and at our school-based clinic sites







#### What peer services do we offer?

Our peers are available to meet with existing clients (or their families) to provide non-clinical support for overcoming barriers associated with mental health care. Currently, our peers are licensed in 2 different areas:

#### **Adult Peer Specialists**

Peers services occur outside of the therapy session, and they work alongside clinicians to help clients meet personal and professional mental health goals and overcome barriers to treatment.

#### Family Peer Advocates:

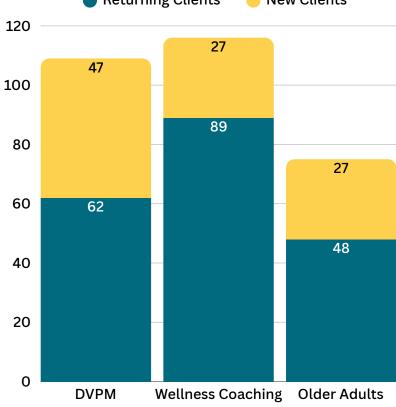
Offer support for parents & caregivers of VCS clients under 21 years old.
Advocates provide emotional support and resources to families, and services are based on each family's individual determined need.

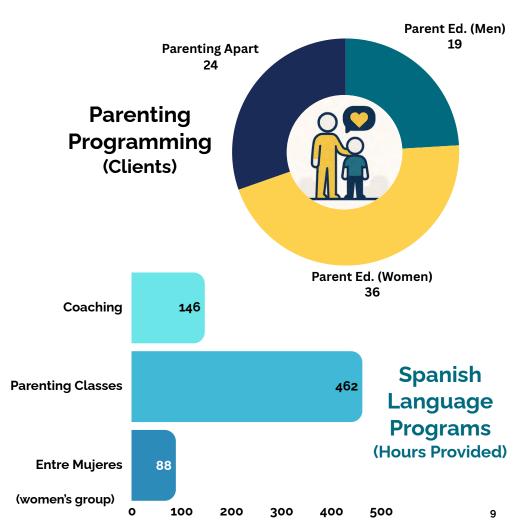
#### Why?

#### The Beth Kipperman Student Advocacy Program

Rachel began the school year alongside her peers and was initially enthusiastic about her 8th-grade experience. However, by October, she began to experience significant symptoms of depression and anxiety, resulting in her missing several months of school. In response, her mother contacted the VCS Student Advocacy Program for assistance in supporting Rachel's return to education. The Advocacy Team promptly coordinated a meeting with the school district, and Rachel was placed into a therapeutic educational environment which provided Rachel with daily therapeutic support, including individual and group counseling; academic continuity, allowing Rachel to stay current with her coursework; and supportive setting to build peer relationships and regain confidence. Rachel gradually found connection and comfort, becoming an active participant in both therapeutic services and peer groups.

She is now looking forward to returning to school and is expressing excitement about entering high school.



#### Clini

When John started therapy he wasn't sure he could stick with it. He shared that even though he wanted to commit, he was worried he might not be able to show up consistently. Since then, John has attended sessions every week. He's fully engaged in the work, and over time, our therapeutic relationship has grown stronger. As a result, John has made meaningful changes in his life. He's become more present, built stronger relationships, & recently applied for a job — something he never thought he could do before. His insight is growing, and he's creating the kind of life he always wanted, with support by his side.



#### **Peer Support Services**

"One of my clients came to VCS needing help finding employment. In our work, we practiced with mock interviews and discussions about the client's skills. Now, he is employed by multiple locations and is meeting his income goals!"

To support the growth of VCS we:

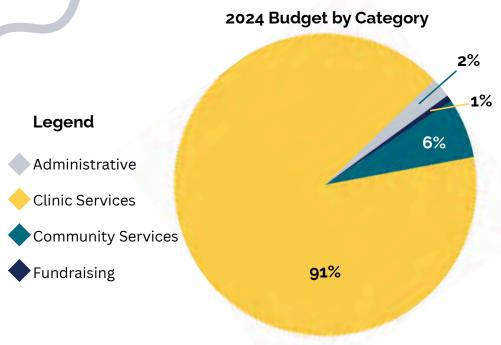
- 1. Hired our first Clinical Administrative Assistant to aid clinic staff with handling higher numbers of clients
