A MESSAGE FROM SARAH

I began my tenure as the VCS Executive Director in August of 2013 and it is hard to believe, at the writing of this letter, almost two years have passed since I walked through the door at VCS to start work! My joke is that once you drink the water at VCS you become part of the agency and never leave. We are fortunate to have many members of staff and our volunteer workforce who have been with VCS for several years and are dedicated in good times and bad.

I have titled this year's annual report: A Year of Action. The staff and myself set about to improve our house last year. We painted, installed new roofing, water proofed the basement, carpeted two floors of the building and had a lot of nice furniture donated by Active International. Many of these 2014 improvements came through the good will of donors in the community as well as agencies like United Way who deploy people to volunteer at local nonprofits twice a year. PDI has been the workforce through United Way who has been kind enough to participate in our massive painting project. We thank Rockland County for its continued support.



In addition to serving countless clients in Rockland County as counselors, volunteers have tended to the front desk and done things like painted the railings leading into our building. VCS Inc. is a remarkable place and we have many plans for 2015 such as opening a licensed mental health clinic within our building to help support our precious resources; the volunteer counseling program and the social justice work we do such as Pride and the Undoing Racism trainings in the county.

Throughout 2014 almost 14,000 hours of service were provided to people seeking help. They turned to VCS for counseling -- often at times of personal and family crisis. We continued to expand our youth counseling programs in schools which have limited or no mental health services. We now offer a Spanish language counselor training program once a year. The need has been apparent for a few years but this year we were actually able to build capacity in order to make it happen. Our domestic violence program has expanded in Orange County making it one of the most viable programs in our agency.

The VCS mission is carried out with a sense of pride and purpose by a unique blend of volunteer and professional staff. Our staffing model provides low cost services for people who are either uninsured or underinsured.

The report that follows is a synopsis of our work and accomplishments in 2014. The greatest measure of our success continues to be the number of individuals, young people and families who look to us for help. Our organization has been a Rockland County institution since 1970 and we celebrate our 45th anniversary in 2015. We are proud to be an important resource for countless people in Rockland County that otherwise would not be able to access services.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS

Agency

- We held our two significant fundraisers for the agency: Our 11th Annual Golf Tournament and the Annual Appeal at the end of the year. We added Tennis to the Golf Tournament for the first time.
- Improvements were made to the infrastructure of the building including half a roof, carpeting, and water drainage in the basement.
- Began process to establish a VCS Clinic.



Counseling and Family Services

In 2014, our programs continued to expand along with the county's growing need for our services. During this year 106 volunteers contributed 12,660 volunteer hours to the agency. We were also home to 11 interns from eight different colleges in the Hudson Valley region.

In April 2014, VCS had the first annual dinner to honor volunteer counselors. The dinner was made possible by a bequest from Stan Hyman, a VCS counselor for many years, who left a bequest in his will to make it possible for volunteers to be honored in the way he thought they should be. The dinner was held at Del'Arte restaurant and was deemed a success by the 65 people in attendance. We were very grateful to Stan for starting a very much needed tradition for our volunteers.

In September 2014, we began our first counselor training all in Spanish. Rosa Serrano-Delgado, VCS Director of Spanish Language Programs, organized this highly successful training and eight more Spanish-speaking counselors joined VCS.

Also in September VCS hosted visitors from the Haitian women's ministry. They were eager to learn more about our models of domestic violence counseling for women and our domestic violence classes for men. It was a very successful visit.

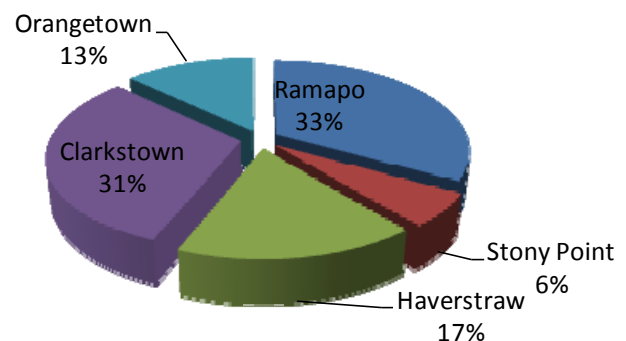
FINS, our intensive counseling program for traumatized high school students and families in the East Ramapo Central School District funded by the Rockland County Youth Bureau, grew and developed remarkably in 2014. We began collaborating with multiple agencies and services including MHA of Rockland, Legal Services of the Hudson Valley, Planned Parenthood, the Rockland County Department of Health, and the Partnership for Safe Youth, to better support the vulnerable students and their families. We began training and working more extensively with gang and sexuality issues. We also provided training for school staff on trauma and child behavioral problems. FINS was awarded a grant by the United Way of Rockland County at the end of the year to expand into North Rockland Central School District in September 2015, so we are looking forward to the upcoming school year and bringing services to other school districts. A huge thank you to our FINS counselors, who go above and beyond to do some tremendous work in some very traumatic situations.

Additional highlights: VCS participated in many community coalitions, collaboratives, and task forces.

- We are regular members of the Health Priorities Steering Committee.
- VCS is home to the Rockland Immigration Coalition.
- In February, we participated in a Children's Legislative Forum to present elected officials with important information about the needs of children in our county.

We also participated in a series of meetings related to creating a Safe Haven for new mothers who needed to give up their babies in safe and legal places.

Distribution of clinical clients in Rockland County



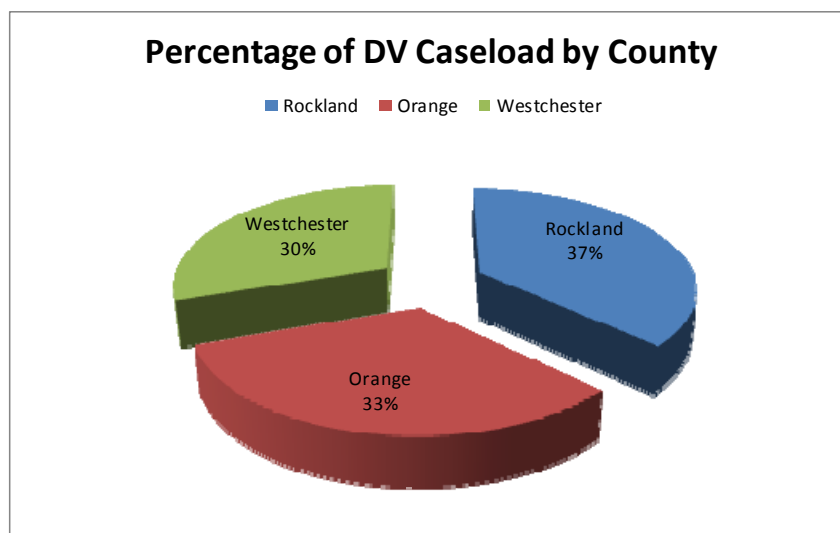

Foster Grandparent Program

- During 2014, 71 Foster Grandparents—including four new volunteers, volunteered in the educational programs around the county.
- The Foster Grandparents were at West Haverstraw Elementary School in Stony Point, NY. One of the volunteers worked in a Regular Ed classroom. The other grandpa worked in the Kindergarten program – serving two classes, one in the morning the other in the afternoon. Most of the Kindergarten students in this class were English Language Learners with whom reading skills were being developing using guided reading, reading aloud, and formulating questions. These two volunteers served 61 students – 23 third graders and 38 kindergarteners (18am/20pm).
- The teachers identified students with whom the grandmas would be assigned to provide individual attention while working with all in the classroom so as not to make the students feel singled out. The grandmas carried out those responsibilities/activities as per teacher's assessment. Some of the functions they worked on with the students were:

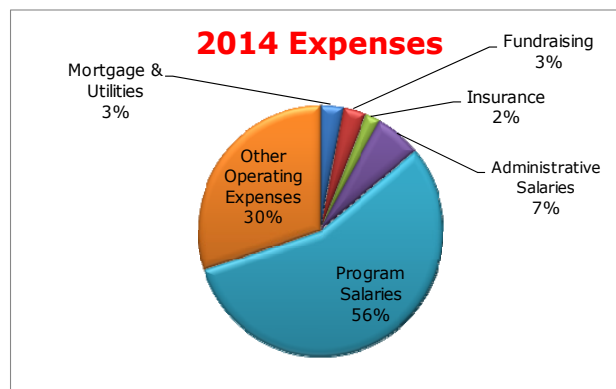
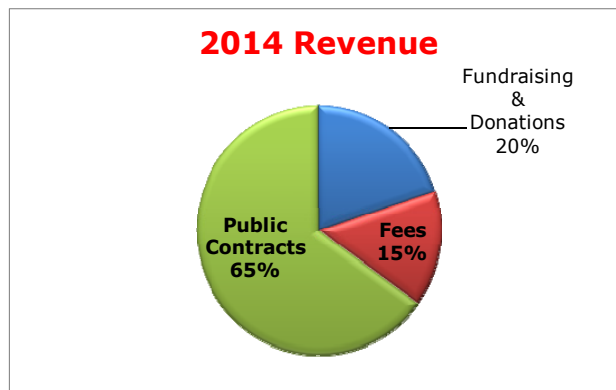
