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
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Ways to Donate



MARKETING & AWARENESS

GOAL: Ignite a powerful wave of awareness that illuminates the VCS mission

UPDATE:

- Improved the visibility of our community impact by diversifying our marketing and utilizing the expertise of the VCS Board of Directors. This included tangible support with social media and PSAs on 100.7 WHUD
- Purchased Fundraising software to aid in outreach
- Through LCM, created a dynamic new "Sponsorship" ad

GOAL: Achieve team engagement and overall job satisfaction

UPDATE:

- Streamlined workflows, upgraded our network, telehealth and billing technologies
- Centralized Intakes
- Increased workstations and computers
- Hired additional psychotherapists, clinical supervisors, and administrative support staff
- Implemented a new organizational structure to maximize communication
- Implemented Peer Support Services to aid in client overall success

FUNDRAISING

GOAL: Increase donations by 300% over the course of 3 years to provide affordable care

STORIES OF US

STUDENT ADVOCACY

Ana is an 11th grader and had been a part of her school district since kindergarten. Despite 12 years in the same district, Ana found herself being told her home was physically in another district (by 100 feet) and would have to change schools. Ana had friends and a support network that would be ripped away from her. Ana was extremely distressed. This was exacerbated by a language barrier between her mother and the district. They sought Ana's older sister to reach out to VCS Student Advocacy program. Beth supported the family, submitted an appeal and was able to get a stay from New York State. Through all the distress and helplessness the family experienced, VCS was able to keep Ana with her school and with her friends.

John is a very bright child who was struggling in school. The school was contacting the parents an exorbitant amount of times for his "disruptive" behavior. So much so that the parents felt the school stopped trying to help him. VCS was able to secure a diagnostic evaluation which identified an autism disorder. VCS helped the family to apply for and secure special education services for John. Now, with teachers who understand, John is surrounded by educators specially trained to support his needs. With the support of VCS, John now has a great chance at succeeding in school.

Oscar is a 13-year-old student with multiple disabilities including Down Syndrome. After several years of no progress despite his mother's plea, the family felt alone in their concerns for Oscar. VCS intervened, and facilitated an update diagnostic evaluation which clearly showed that not only was Oscar not making progress in school but his skills were actually declining!



Through our work, Oscar was placed in a more appropriate program in school and now has a bright future to maximize his skills. The family is grateful to VCS!

SCHOOL BASED CLINICS

CLINIC

John struggled with confidence issues in all aspects of his life, in relationships, work and entering graduate school. Through his work with VCS, he learned skills to increase his motivation and self-confidence. He uses his skills every day and has grown his self-worth. John now has hope and believes in himself.

As a teenager, Michele was in therapy and felt traumatized by those negative experiences. Through VCS' ongoing compassionate care, Michele has reengaged with therapy and actively engages in services with VCS. More importantly, she can feel and see the positive changes she has made in her life as a result.

Henry was consumed with anger. He was paralyzed by it. He was angry at his parents, women he wanted to date and even hate towards God. Over time, Henry built up his confidence to recognize the steps he can proactively take in his life to remove the burden of this hate. He also began to improve his appearance in search of a partner. Today, Henry found his partner and has found solace returning to God. Physically and emotionally, Henry is confident and traded in hatred for hope.





STORIES OF US (CONTINUED)

OLDER ADULTS

Nancy was diagnosed with a life-altering illness, robbing her of her ability to live independently. VCS helped her navigate from "mourning" her former self to overcoming insecurities of feeling like a burden to those around her. Over time, Nancy "found her voice" and gained confidence in expressing her own needs and desires to family and Nursing Home staff members.

Rose is 96 years old now living with her son and his wife. Rose experiences severe anxiety and fears leaving the security of home. Leaving behind her independence, Rose feels shame at being homebound and having to rely on her family. Through her work with VCS, Rose has learned skills to relieve her overwhelming anxiety so that she can be more independent. She has gained a wonderful appreciation of her own self and the life she has lived. Rose has a "giver" nature and has taken care of people her entire life. Now, she deserves time to relax and be taken care of.

PARENTING APART

While providing much needed support to the women with active cases we serve, we find the hardest part for them is the waiting. There aren't many wins when you are being accused of things by someone you share children with. There are a few ups but many more downs. "How can they not see what is going on" is a common phrase. In the Parenting Apart group, we spend most sessions reminding these women of their value and their successes as mothers.


